

### Happy May Day!

May Day, also known as Labour Day or International Worker's Day, was born in the US out of the 8-hour workday movement in 1886 Chicago. 16-hour shifts were not unusual for the industrial-era Amera. May 1, 1886, was the date that the American Federation of Labour set for workers nationwide to go on strike demanding an 8-hour workday. The multi-day strike is known as the Haymarket Affair of 1886. The strike became deadly on May 3rd when a bomb went off killing several police officers and civilians. Four anarchists were found guilty of conspiracy of murder and sentenced to death. August Spies and Albert Parsons, two of the men found guilty, yelled these words that resounded across North America, Mexica, and UK: "Let the voice of the people be heard!" followed by "The time will come when our silence will be more powerful than the voices you are strangling today" (*The Haymarket Tragedy*, by Paul Avrich in 1984)

### Did You Know

Article 23.300 - all union members receive 4-hr religious time any time of the year.

Article 22.110 – use 3 or less sick leave days in a year you receive an additional personal day. – make sure doctor time is coded as sick doctor time and not sick time!

Article 22.111 – after accumulating 65 sick leave days and you want your additional personal day as described above, contact HR no later than June 1st

# How Your Union Is Working for You

We spoke with a fellow support staff member who talked with us on how the union has personally benefitted her. She begins by telling us that she landed the job of her dreams with SVSU just 6 months prior to covid. During covid, a lot of staff members were working from home. It was during this time that some departments were unexpectedly forced to downsize. In this case, another Union Staff member with higher seniority was displaced due to their job being eliminated, which gave the other more senior staff member the right to bump this newer support staff member from her current position. She was very nervous that she was about to lose her job, but our union stepped in and was there to explain to her the options she had.

She was given the choice to stay with SVSU and be bumped down one level to a new position or she had the choice to be laid off. She chose to take the position one level lower as it was certainly a better option than being laid off during covid.

The union was there for her and worked right by her side to help facilitate her transition during this scary and stressful time. Ultimitately, in an unexpected turn of events, a coworker of hers decided to retire and the person of seniority who was displaced and had bumped her from her dream position ended up taking the retiring coworker's position, so she was able to keep her own dream job. Even though she was able to retain her dream job, she had the support of the union to help reduce her stress and give her peace of mind during the very scary and uncertain time when she was facing displacement. Had our staff member worked for a company outside of SVSU, she likely would have completely lost her job with that company just as many people did during covid.
